

**This week we are focusing on the fairy tale 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'.**


## **Tasks for all:**

You do not have to do all of them. Choose one that you would like to do. See if you can challenge yourself.

1. Can you find 5 things that start with the same sounds a 'Goat' (g) and 'Troll' (t).
2. The Troll was very unkind to the Three Billy Goats Gruff. Talk to a grown up about the unkind things he did or said. Try and think of some of the things he could do instead. Can you draw a picture of write a sentence to show the Troll how to be a good friend.

# Maths Task

Today's focus is **Number and Place Value**.

You do not have to do all the tasks. Choose one that you would like to do. See if you can challenge yourself.



1. Can you write these numbers in smallest to largest?

7 51 19 35 22

1. Can you write out the numbers 1 to 10 in words (for example 1 - one, 2 - two)

1. Write out 2 sets of number cards 1-12 The first player rolls the two dice. They can turn over the cards which are the same as the numbers rolled. For example, if a 4 and 5 are rolled, they would turn over the 4 and 5 cards. If a double is thrown, the player's turn ends. They can roll the dice again until they can't turn over any more cards. The cards that are left showing are then added and that is their score.

The dice are then passed to the next player who turns the cards the right way up again and then rolls the dice in the same way as player one. They now can keep on rolling dice as long as each time they can turn over some new cards. Remember that if a double is thrown, the player's turn ends. When the player can't turn over any more cards, those that are left are added together and that is the player's score. The winner is the person with the lower score. It can be played with just one turn each or each player can have a number of turns that you decide at the beginning of the game.

1. Solve some word problems. Can you represent your answer with pictures or objects.

There a 2 goats in a shed. The shed can house 10 goats. How many more goats can i put in the shed?

In my garden, there are 7 red birds and 13 yellow birds. How many birds are there altogether?
