

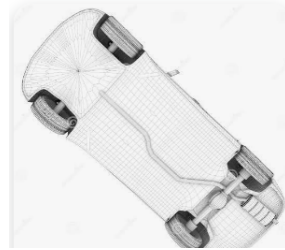
Home learning ideas: Transport

Choose a task for each week of the term. We want you to be engaged with your homework so there is a lot of choice for you. You can either share your work electronically or add to your homework book.

Interview a grandparent or older relative about how they travelled to school when they were younger. What can they tell you about how transport has changed in their life time?



Draw a simple sketch of a toy car from the side and from underneath. Label the primary functional parts using your key DT words: **wheel**, **axle**, **chassis**, and **axle holder**.



Have a look at the toy vehicles you have at home. What materials are they made of? Group them into different materials. What are most of the vehicles made from?



Bake some cookies or a cake together using a vehicle theme.



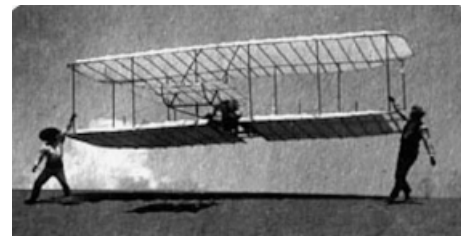
Design your own futuristic vehicle. Does it fly? Does it travel underwater? What fuel does it use to move? Draw it and add labels if you want to.



Make your own vehicle. You could make it from recycling, lego, play dough, you choose.



Choose one famous person who changed how we travel and make a mini-poster about them.
