


History; We will be following a number of enquiries to learn about WW2. We will look at the causes of the war and understand who was involved in the war. We will examine The Blitz and explore the impact on Coventry. We will explore evacuation and understand that the fiction we read about an evacuee's experiences are based on sources of evidence. We will be looking at the impact of WW2 on Banbury and examine our school's log book to find out about local life in the period. We will examine the different roles men played in the war and what this meant for women.

Computing; The computing element of the project looks at coding. To develop coding skills, children will have the opportunity to explore program design and put computational thinking into practice.

Maths; This term's work will begin with a further two weeks on multiplication and division. Then we will go on to explore fractions; we will use common factors to simplify fractions: use common multiples to express to fractions in the same denomination. We will compare and order fractions including >1 . We will add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions.

RE; We will be learning how to make links between the narrative of the resurrection and Christian beliefs about life after death and the significance of the resurrection for understanding the nature of Jesus. We will learn how a Christian understanding of the resurrection might influence the way that Christians respond to death. We will be able to explain why many Christians believe that Jesus' resurrection is important. We will compare how different faiths prepare their loved ones for death and what they believe comes next.

English; As part of our topic Espionage, children will study the books Anne Frank and Goodnight Mister Tom to understand the effects of war from the view of a child. Children will learn about the contrasting experiences and the profound impact the war had on their lives. As these texts explore the emotional turmoil these children experienced, our writing will be heavily centred around conveying tone.

MFL; we will continue our French language journey using Rigolo and Salut! Ca va? The children will know that France is in Europe and there are many French speaking countries throughout the world.

PE; Year 5 and 6 will be developing their skills in netball with a focus on ball skills, foot work, positioning and different types of dodging.

PSHE; Children will be learning about positive, happy and healthy relationships. They will recognise how to judge when a friendship is making them feel unhappy or uncomfortable, managing conflict, how to manage these situations and when to seek help from others. Children will also learn the key facts about puberty and the changing adolescent body.
